Groundbreaking for AIS Campus @ Nusantara IKN

I was joined by a number of AIS staff and Board members on Wednesday for the Groundbreaking Ceremony for the AIS Nusantara IKN Campus. I was very proud to be a part of the traveling team that included not only Board members, senior leaders and expat teachers, but also members of our administrative team and support staff, many of whom have been members of the AIS staff for more than 20 years.

The Team from AIS were joined for the ground breaking ceremony by the **President of the Republic of Indonesia**, **Joko Widodo**, attending ministers, members of the IKN Authority and other invited guests and dignitaries. I spoke about AIS commitment to becoming a part of Indonesia's dynamic new capital and its ambitious plan for the Golden Generation 2045. AIS's master development project will include a new AIS campus, vocational and special education centres plus an Australian university. AIS is firmly committed to supporting the Indonesian government's initiative to relocate the nation's capital to IKN Nusantara.

Year 3 Maths

Students have been working in Maths this week on 3D objects. They first reviewed the names and properties of 2D shapes before learning some new objects, such as prisms, pyramids and spheres. The students used straws and modelling clay to create a cube and then worked with the teacher to co-construct a procedure writing of how to make a cube. This then helped them be more independent when they went on to create other models of prisms and pyramids. They wrote procedures for the models they created and instructed their friends in other groups on how to make them.
