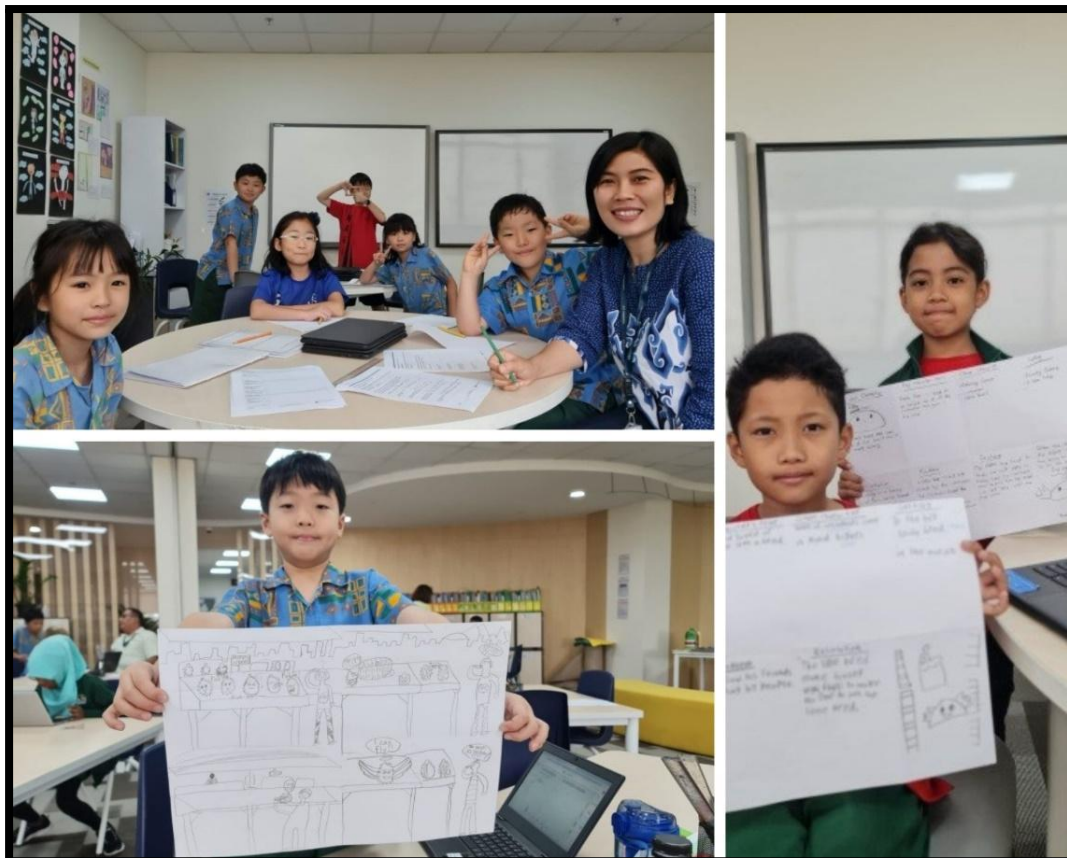
Year 3 EAL

Narratives. Who doesn't love diving into an imaginative story?

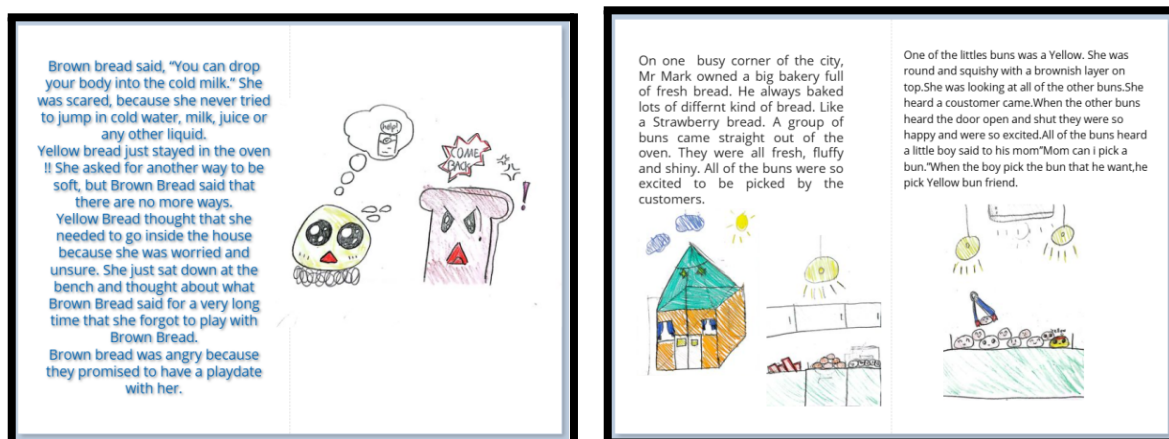
For nearly three terms, Year 3 EAL students immersed themselves in narrative writing, and their enthusiasm never faded away. They developed a stronger grasp of story structure and grew more confident in creating their own narratives.



Each student in the Year 3 EAL class eagerly worked through the process of planning, drafting, and illustrating their individual stories, with the main theme focused on overcoming fear. They shared ideas for their characters, the fears they would face, and how each character would ultimately overcome their challenges. After writing their drafts, students welcomed feedback from their teacher, using it to revise and strengthen their work.

Year 7 and 11's Mangrove Forest Visit at PIK

Our Year 7 and Year 11 General Science students recently visited the Mangrove Forest in PIK, learning about the importance of mangroves in protecting coastlines, supporting local ecosystems, and even slowing climate change. During the presentation, students got to try mangrove tea, giving them a unique introduction to these fascinating ecosystems.



Next, they rolled up their sleeves and got hands-on with the mangroves, planting young trees and getting a bit muddy in the process. Afterwards, they split into groups to investigate the ecosystem more closely. One group used a dichotomous key to identify mangrove species, another tested the water and soil, and the last group looked at the factors that support plant growth using a quadrat and transect line.



It was a practical, informative day that helped students connect their learning to real-world environmental work. We're looking forward to seeing how this experience broadens their understanding of conservation.
