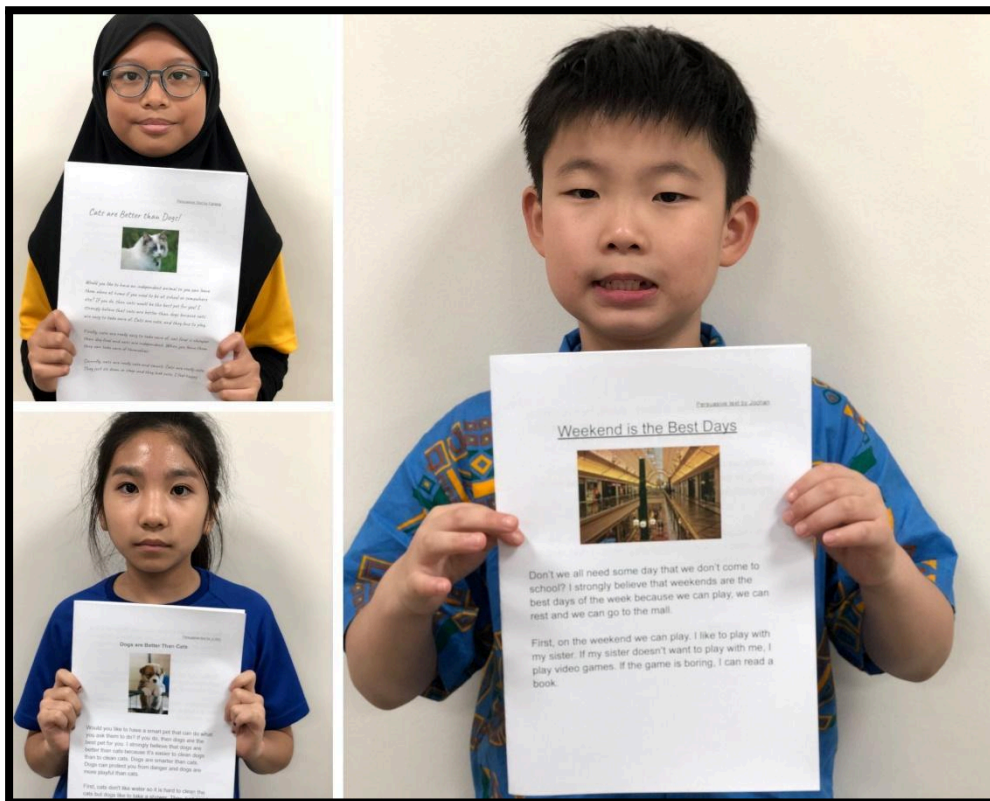
To begin, we explored the purpose of persuasive writing: to influence readers' thoughts and actions. We analyzed a sample text, "Summer is the Best Season of the Year," and dissected its structure. Students learned the importance of:

- **A Strong Opening:** Start with a rhetorical question and clearly stating an opinion or point of view with some emotive language, supported by relevant reasons.
- **Subsequent Paragraphs:** Elaborating on each reason with specific examples or evidence.
- **A Conclusive Ending:** Restating the main point in a new way.

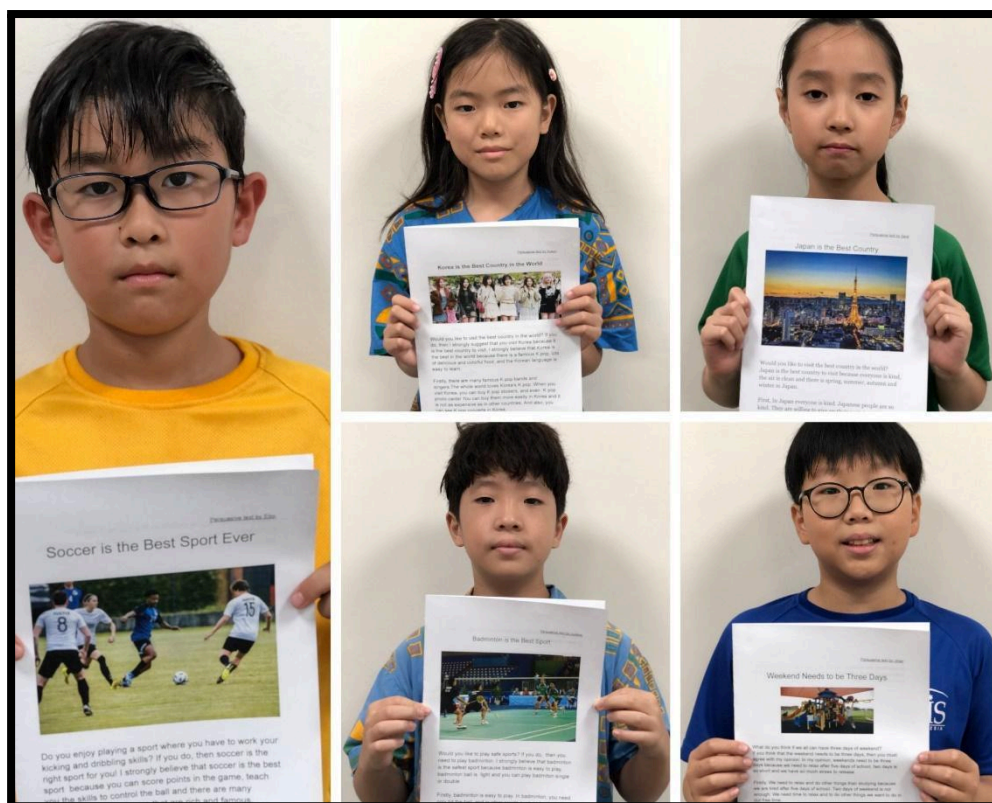




Next, we engaged in a lively brainstorming session to generate their personal interest and topics. Students shared their thoughts on various subjects, including the best pets, favorite sports, and pressing issues like weekend length and the best country in the world. We then guided them in planning their persuasive pieces.



It was truly heartening to witness the enthusiasm and creativity of the students. Despite needing occasional support with phrasing, they confidently selected topics, formulated their opinions, and provided compelling evidence to support their arguments.



After drafting their initial pieces, students diligently worked on editing and refining their work, ultimately producing very personal final drafts.
