


PnF Executive Committee Voting

Students in Year 6 have been learning about Chemical Sciences through the unit titled 'Change Detectives'. In this fun unit, students become investigators, identifying and explaining physical and chemical changes to everyday materials through activities including -

- investigating if melted or frozen objects can be returned to their original state
- observing the factors that make materials melt most quickly
- exploring factors relating to evaporation
- exploring what happens when candles are burnt



The students have been having a great time learning and the activities have required us to really think deeply. We have often had to refer our questions to Dr Dean Shippy in the high school to help us with tricky questions such as -


'Is perfume evaporating a reversible or irreversible change?'

and

'Is salt dissolving purely physical, or is there a chemical change also?'



Through hands-on investigations, students are developing key skills such as making predictions, identifying independent and dependent variables, and drawing conclusions based on evidence.


