Year 4 EAL

The Year 4 EAL students have been actively participating in a dynamic and enjoyable learning environment. They've engaged in a variety of fun English activities, including spelling, grammar, speaking, and listening, as well as reading and writing. While their favorite activities, such as role-play, English games, and quizzes, have been a hit, they have also focused on the English unit on Traditional Stories this term.



Throughout the unit, the students read and analyzed a range of traditional tales, exploring the differences between genres like fairy tales, fables, and folktales. They watched animated versions of these stories, participated in discussions, and retold them using the 5Ws and H questions.



To demonstrate their understanding, they identified key structural and language features in each story. The class then focused on the classic Cinderella tale, engaging in activities that explored both literal and inferred meanings, as well as analyzing the moral or message of the story.



After an in-depth study of fairy tales, the Emerging, Developing, and Consolidating Level of EAL students began planning, drafting, and publishing their own alternative versions of Cinderella, while the Beginning Level of EAL students retold the story in their own words. The task is still in progress, but once their drafts are proofread, they will type, publish, and present their stories to a younger audience.

POTADS - Down Syndrome Awareness Gifts


