Freestyle Klim Swim Clinic a Success at AIS Indonesia

On Saturday, April 19th, 2025, AIS Indonesia hosted a dynamic Freestyle Klim Swim Clinic. The event saw enthusiastic participation from approximately 18 students, including six swimmers from AIS eager to refine their freestyle technique. Representing AIS were Jasmin (Year 7), Santy (Year 8), Bluebelle, Dharma & Olivia (Year 9), and Hayeon (Year 9).

The clinic kicked off with a comprehensive warm-up and stretching session led by Alex Taraskin, the experienced Klim Swim Coach. Following this, Olympic gold medalist Michael Klim himself provided invaluable insights into the crucial elements of an efficient freestyle stroke. His guidance covered key aspects such as optimal head and body position, effective stroke length, maintaining an appropriate stroke rate (tempo), proper above-water recovery, a powerful underwater pull, and essential freestyle skills including dives, turns, and finishes.

Adding further inspiration and expertise, special guest Patricia Yoshita, a SEA Games Champion and National Swimming Record Holder, generously shared valuable tips to help our students elevate their swimming abilities.
