Principal's Update

Today, I joined 11 other teachers in a First Aid Training session led by trainers from Medika Plaza. Last week, another 16 staff members completed the same workshop. As a result, all 36 staff attending our upcoming camps (Years 3 & 4, 5 & 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11) will have completed First Aid Training in 2022 or later. In total, more than 70 of our staff have received First Aid Training within the past three years which shows the school's strong commitment to safety and preparedness.



We had a lovely assembly yesterday, celebrating lots of the things that our students have been doing during the last few weeks; from swimming and soccer to basketball, Model United Nations to World Scholar's Cup and including an insight into the work that some of the Year 11 and 12 students do with the Orphanage Project. Many thanks to all of the staff who organise these events and support the students to take part.

Earlier this week all of the Years 7 to 10 competed in the Big Science Quiz in their Science lessons. This is an Australian Science comprehension competition which pits our students against Science students in Australia and other international school students in our area. It pushes our students outside their comfort zone with some testing questions based on the Acara curriculum and beyond.

We appreciate your support in making sure that students are in school in time for their assessments. They will have normal lessons during the rest of each day so that their week is balanced and to help keep the assessments in perspective, giving the students time for PE, creative subjects and SET as well as the rest of their normal timetable.

Students who need translation to be able to access the assessments will be able to use translation dictionaries throughout the assessments. If they do not have a translation dictionary then they will have timed access to translation apps like Google translate on their laptops.

You can help your child to prepare for these assessments by supporting them with their study, giving them a quiet place to work, giving them time to revise and making sure that they continue to eat healthily, to sleep properly and to exercise as they would do normally. Research indicates that children in Years 7 to 11 should be getting between 8 and 10 hours of sleep a night and this can best be

supported by ensuring that mobile phones, tablets and other devices are removed from their rooms at night and for the hour before they sleep.

It is important for the students to get into good habits and one of those is to be able to take assessments like this in their stride. We will not be judging the students based on their results, but will take the results into account when considering how the students can improve and how well they have understood this semester's work. Taking time to prepare and revise allows the students to see what they really know and how confidently they can apply their knowledge when solving problems and will help us to support the students to improve during the rest of the year.


