### **Eid Al-Adha**





This week I had the privilege of taking our Year 4 students on an art trip, visiting Jakarta Maritime Museum. They explored the incredible Erub Art exhibition by Torres Strait Islander artists, showcasing powerful sculptures made from abandoned fishing nets.



This unique art raises awareness about ocean pollution and marine life, perfectly tying into their classroom Sustainability unit.



Students also created sea creatures using fishing net string and learnt about the spice trade and colonisation, deepening their understanding of the museum's historical context.



This exhibition highlights the problem of ocean pollution and teaches us about marine conservation and how our actions affect the environment.



It was a wonderful way to see how art can teach us about protecting our planet! We all thoroughly enjoyed ourselves, it was a fantastic experience.

An Inspiring Return: Emma Batty's CAS Journey









We were delighted to welcome back AIS alumna, Emma Batty, on Friday 30th May, who shared her remarkable CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service) journey with our current Year 11 students. It was an incredibly insightful and inspiring session that truly showcased the transformative power of the IB Diploma Programme's CAS component.

Emma spoke passionately about how her CAS projects at AIS opened doors to extraordinary opportunities. From spearheading environmental campaigns within the school community to engaging in diverse marine biology initiatives across Indonesia and globally, her experiences have been nothing short of exceptional. She highlighted how these foundational projects directly influenced her degree programme and subsequent career path.

#### **Year 7 at Museum Bahari (Maritime Museum)**

A Historical Journey Through Marine Culture and the Modern Dilemma of Net-Casting on Sea Life

This exhibition showcases 18 artworks by **Erub Arts, a Torres Strait Islander group, showing how sea life is harmed by abandoned fishing nets,** or "ghost nets."

The art also shares stories of Islander culture and the efforts of Indigenous rangers who remove these nets. It ties into Indonesia's growing concern about ocean pollution and marine conservation, marking **the first Australian exhibit in Indonesia** to focus on this issue.



The museum offers workshops where students can make marine animals from fishing nets, linking to an Australian exhibition and raising awareness about ocean pollution affecting both Australia and Indonesia. The museum itself is in one of Jakarta's oldest heritage buildings, adding to the cultural experience.

## AIS Swimmers Make a Splash at Global Jaya Competition!

What an incredible day for our AIS swimmers at the recent Global Jaya Swimming Competition! Eight of our talented athletes dove in, bringing home a fantastic haul of **12 individual medals** and showcasing incredible spirit and determination.

Our team, comprising six High School swimmers (Jasmin, Santy, Bluebelle, Olivia, Hayeon, and Andres) and two Primary School swimmers (Imogen Baker and Adept Orcales), delivered an impressive performance, securing **4 individual gold, 3 individual silver, and 5 individual bronze medals!** 









Our High School Girls' swimming team demonstrated exceptional teamwork and speed, powering through to clinch **gold medals** in both the **4x25M freestyle relay** and the **4x25M medley relay!** A huge congratulations to the team for these outstanding victories.

Let's celebrate our phenomenal individual medalists and their hard work:

- **Imogen Baker (Year 3)** was an absolute star in the 8 & under age group, dominating her events to win **3 gold medals** (25M freestyle, 25M breaststroke, and 25M butterfly) and a bronze in 25M backstroke!
- **Jasmin Smith (Year 7)** showed her versatility, earning **2 silver medals** (100M Individual Medley, 25M Butterfly) and a bronze medal in 25M freestyle in the 11-12 age group.
- Santy Strain (Year 8) secured a well-deserved **gold medal** in 50M Backstroke and a silver medal in 100M Individual Medley in the 13-14 age group.
- **Bluebelle Smith (Year 9)** swam strong to earn **2 bronze medals** in 50M Breaststroke and 50M Butterfly in the 13-14 age group.
- Olivia Torres Luquin (Year 9) rounded out our medalists with a bronze medal in 50M freestyle in the 13-14 age group.

We're also incredibly proud of **Yoon Hayeon (Year 9)** for breaking her personal best in the 50M freestyle event – a true testament to her dedication! A huge shout-out also goes to **Andres (Year 7)** and **Adept Orcales (Year 4)** for bravely taking on their first high school and first-ever swimming competitions, respectively. These experiences are invaluable for their development as athletes, building confidence and resilience in the pool.



We extend our sincere gratitude to all the parents who came out to cheer relentlessly from the benches and patiently waited until the very end of the competition. Your support makes a tremendous difference to our swimmers!

### **Science Comes Alive with Professor Stephen Ashworth**

Today we had the pleasure of welcoming **Professor Stephen Ashworth**, Professor of Chemistry at the University of East Anglia (UK), who delivered an exciting and interactive **Science Show** to our students.

There were two performances — the first for students in **Years 5–9**, and the second for those in **Years 10–12**. Both shows were filled with spectacular demonstrations that brought scientific concepts to life in fun and accessible ways.

Using everyday kitchen equipment and ingredients, Professor Ashworth explored the properties of solids, liquids and gases, even managing to make a glass of water disappear! He created new materials, including oxygen using Elephant's Toothpaste, and entertained the audience with slime-making, dramatic chemical reactions using sodium bicarbonate and vinegar, and much more.

The performance was a lively blend of science, storytelling and humour, and it captivated students from start to finish.

Following the show, Professor Ashworth spent time with our Year 11 and 12 Chemistry students, sharing insights into life in a university chemistry lab and the wide range of opportunities a Chemistry degree can offer. He challenged students to think about the future, noting that many careers that exist today didn't exist just five years ago — and that the job they may one day pursue might not even exist yet.

It was a truly inspiring day that sparked curiosity and imagination across all year levels. A huge thank you to Professor Ashworth for visiting and sharing his passion for science with us!
