


Looking ahead, we have some exciting events coming up:




Year 5 EAL



This term, Year 5 EAL students are learning about poetry. In the first five weeks, students will listen to, read, and view a range of poems, including odes and lyric poems from different contexts. They will interpret and evaluate these poems, focusing on meaning and language. The unit began with an introduction to the elements of poetry and poetic devices, which students will use and identify in their reading.



Next week, students will begin reading ode poems and apply their knowledge to identify poetic elements and language features within them.



In the second half of the term, students will explore narrative poetry. They will listen to, read, and view a range of narrative poems, and later create a digital multimodal narrative by transforming one of these poems into a new form.
