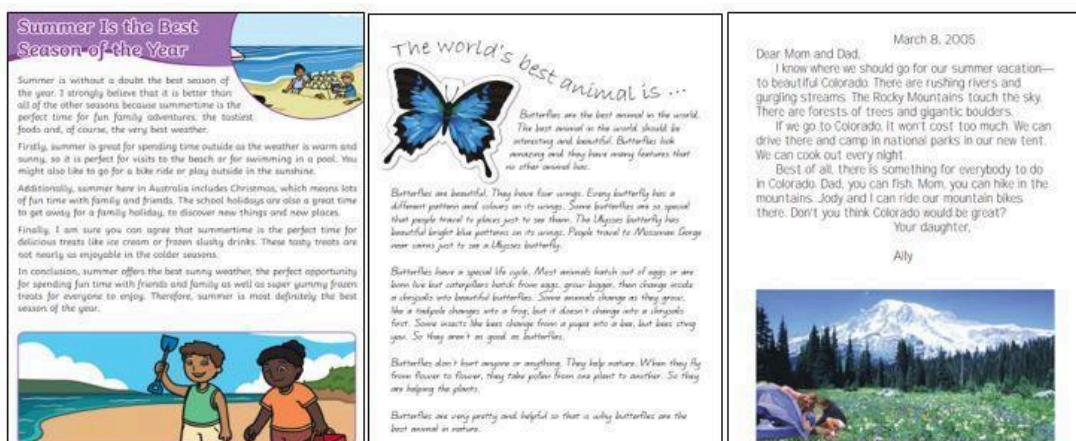

### Year 2 EAL- Persuasive Text

Year 2 EAL introduction to persuasive text started with discussion about some of the things that we think are important, such as: reading is the best hobby a child could have, children should receive pocket money, birthday parties should be banned, or whether children should donate their Christmas presents. While this discussion has helped the students to generate their personal, persuasive ideas, it also revealed the purpose of persuasive text: to convince others of our point of view.



Next, we examined persuasive text samples and analysed its structure. Persuasive text begins with an introduction stating the author's point of view with brief supporting reasons. The body paragraphs then elaborates on these reasons with explanation and evidence. Lastly, the conclusion finalises the text with the author restating the point of view, and summarises the reasons using varied language.







We also learned words and phrases that are essential to writing persuasive:

- a. emotive phrases, phrases that are put together to express and evoke an audience's emotion and are used in the introduction paragraph when we introduce our point of view. For example: I strongly believe that.., It is clear that..., It is so important...
- b. sequencing words at the beginning of each supporting reason: firstly, secondly, additionally, finally.
- c. 'In conclusion' is a phrase that signals the end and the conclusion of the persuasive text. Moreover, summary transition phrases restate our point of view in the conclusion paragraph, that include: therefore, for these reasons, in light of the evidence,...

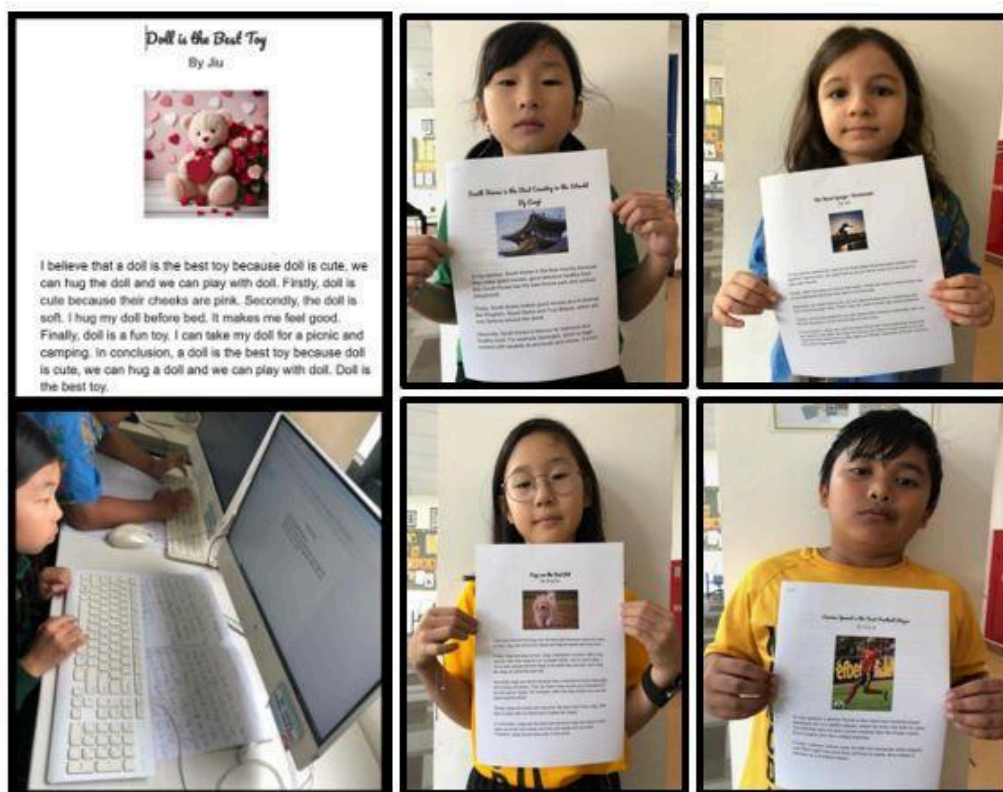
