Exploring How Materials Change in Year 1 Science

Our Year 1 students have been enthusiastically exploring the Science unit "Bend It and Stretch It", a hands-on investigation into how everyday materials can be physically changed. To begin the inquiry, children examined a range of familiar objects and discussed the different actions such as bending, twisting, stretching, folding, and pressing that can cause materials to change shape. This prompted students to share their own ideas and predictions about how materials behave.



Throughout the unit, students rotated through a series of engaging activities that encouraged experimentation and close observation. They tested materials like paper, foil, playdough, pipe cleaners, and cardboard, investigating which items could be easily bent or stretched and which were harder to manipulate. During each activity, students recorded what they noticed, compared results with their peers, and used scientific language to describe the changes they observed.



These practical experiences helped students develop a deeper understanding of why we change materials and how their properties influence their use in everyday life. The unit has been a wonderful opportunity for our Year 1 students to build confidence, think creatively, and enjoy discovering how the world around them works.

ANBK Results – Rapor Pendidikan

In August–September this year, some of our students from Grades 5, 8, and 11 took part in the ANBK (Computer-Based National Assessment). They represented our Primary, Secondary, and High School levels. The assessment took place over two days and included Literacy, Numeracy, a School Environment Survey, and a Character Survey. The assessment was supervised by an invigilator from another school.

As the ANBK is conducted entirely in Bahasa Indonesia, and our students' proficiency differs from that of students in local schools, the results may not fully reflect their true abilities or our overall school condition. However, considering that our students study in an English-speaking environment for most of the day (except during Indonesian lessons), the results are still quite strong for our school.

From the summary, most areas are marked in green, indicating good performance. The yellow areas show aspects that need improvement, while the red areas indicate areas requiring deeper attention and further development.

Genesis Swimming Meets: A Medal Haul for AIS



We are delighted to share the remarkable success of our high school swimmers who made a huge splash at the Genesis Swimming Meets in Serpong, BSD, Tangerang, on Sunday, November 23rd, 2025.

Our team, comprising Jasmin Smith (Y7), Santy Strain (Y8), Bluebelle Smith (Y9), and Olivia Torres Gjerding (Y9) demonstrated true AIS grit. Despite the early start and distant venue, their determination was unmatched, resulting in a phenomenal nine medals haul.

The hard work of our individual athletes shone through the results:

- **Santy (Y8):** Santy had a spectacular day, claiming four Gold Medals in the 50M Backstroke, 25M Backstroke, 50M Freestyle, and the 4x50m Freestyle Relay. She also earned a Silver in the 25M Freestyle.
- **Bluebelle (Y9):** Bluebelle contributed a Gold medal from the 4x50m Freestyle Relay, added two Silver medals (50M Butterfly, 25M Butterfly), and secured a Bronze in the 50M Breaststroke.

- **Jasmin (Y7):** Jasmin was a key member of the victorious 4x50m Freestyle Relay team (Gold) and earned an individual Bronze medal in the 25M Butterfly.
- **Olivia (Y9):** Olivia anchored the successful 4x50m Freestyle Relay team, bringing home a well-deserved Gold medal.
