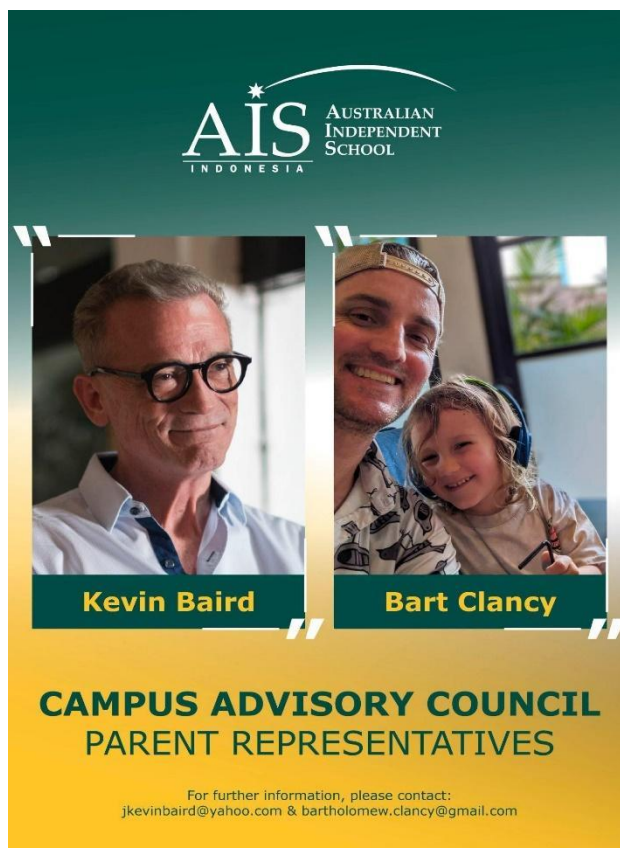

Co-operative education is a work-integrated learning program where students have the opportunity to work full-time in an industry related to their field of study.

Most co-op programs are structured where students may acquire several terms of paid work experience that will complement what they learn in class and it's a great way to start developing their career path.

The work terms and the study terms are part of the curriculum; however, the co-op component can not be more than half of the duration of study.
