Indonesian National Accreditation - Primary School Visit

As part of the Indonesian National Accreditation process for schools led by BAN (National Accreditation Council), we recently concluded our Primary School Accreditation visit. We are pleased to share that the visit went very well. The assessors provided positive feedback on several aspects of our school, including:

- The strong sense of belonging and the joyful yet purposeful atmosphere for learning observed throughout our primary classrooms and campus.
- The clear evidence of collaboration, professionalism, and teamwork among staff.
- The warm welcome extended by everyone from the Yayasan, Principal, teachers, and staff.

The assessors also provided some helpful recommendations for improvement, which will be incorporated into our 2026–2030 Action Plan, currently being developed.

Special thanks go to Ibu Ani, Ibu Nada, Pak Yohan, Mr. Mifta, and Pak Arief for their hard work in preparing the documentation for the visit. We also thank Ms. Mo for her support during the visit and extend our appreciation to the Primary School students and parents who participated in the interviews with the assessors.

We will continue the accreditation process with visits for Senior School (Years 11–12) next week and High School (Years 7–10) in Week 3.



Taipans Shine At Hawks Cup!



Over the holidays, our Senior Boys and Girls Basketball Teams competed in the Global Jaya School "Hawks Cup" Tournament. The event featured 9 boys' teams and 6 girls' teams from across Jakarta — many of whom we had never faced before.

Our boys' team played exceptionally well, making it all the way to the finals and finishing as silver medalists, earning Rp 1,750,000 in prize money.

Our girls' team also reached the finals and came away champions, winning the gold medal, the championship trophy, and Rp 2,500,000! Congratulations to Nana Yanagawa (Year 10) for winning the Most Valuable Player award overall for girls basketball.

All prize money will go toward purchasing the team's new white uniforms.

A huge congratulations to both teams for their hard work, teamwork, and Taipan spirit! A huge thank you to Ms Jill who gave up her holiday time to coach both teams.



Michael Klim Visit Next Week

We are excited to welcome Michael Klim, Olympic Gold Medalist and former world record holder, to AIS Jakarta next Thursday and Friday. During his visit, Michael will oversee Klim Swim swimming lessons and squad sessions with our students.

While on campus, he will also speak at both school assemblies — the High School Assembly (rescheduled to 8:10 am on Thursday) and the Primary School Assembly (8:10 am on Friday). In addition, Michael will join parents at the PnF Welcome Back Morning Tea on Friday, where he will give an overview of Klim Swim.




For families new to the AIS community, Michael Klim is one of Australia's most celebrated swimmers, with an outstanding record that includes 6 Olympic medals (2 gold), 11 Commonwealth Games medals, and 26 World Championship medals. During his career, he held 20 world records and is widely regarded as one of the greatest relay swimmers of all time — notably setting a 100m freestyle world record in the lead-off leg of the gold-medal-winning 4x100m freestyle relay at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.



What a vibrant and busy start to the term it's been in the Art room! The energy is incredible as our students are both putting the final touches on excellent creations carried over from last term and launching into a range of new and exciting artistic explorations.



From Preschool 3 right through to Year 6, our students have absolutely taken every opportunity to express their imagination. They're creating a wide range of artworks by exploring a diverse range of artistic styles and techniques, taking inspiration from masters of the past and present.



Here's our Year-Level Art class update focus for the next 2 weeks

Preschool Finishing their lion face artwork, using fork printing to create a wonderfully textured mane.

Foundation Creating expressive, abstract polar bear pieces with pastels, inspired by artist Erik Abel's use of vibrant colour and layered textures.

Year 1 Focusing on texture and mood in their art, learning to draw a tree using pastels with different line work and colour.

Year 2 The Advancing their African sunset pieces, exploring the science of light and shadow as they trace a giraffe silhouette using mixed media.

Year 3 (Creating a beautiful mixed media Uluru artwork, drawing inspiration from Aboriginal artist Danny Eastwood and combining pastels, paint, and traditional dot painting.

Year 4
Working on a stunning watercolour painting, using precise proportion to capture a bridge silhouette against a warm sky.

Year 5 Getting creative with their fun mixed-media Halloween monsters, using pens and dye to design unique, detailed features.

Social and Emotional Thinking

- **Year 7:** This term, we will be completing our unit on Digital Safety and beginning our unit on Mindfulness. Students will continue to learn to identify big emotions and practice using mindful techniques to handle stress, anxiety, feelings of overwhelmedness, and strategies to increase focus.
- **Year 8:** Upon completion of our unit on Alcohol, Year 8's will learn about Resilience. Students will learn ways to manage strong emotions, positive thinking and self-talk, coping with change and uncertainty, and developing a growth mindset.
- **Year 9:** Students will complete the unit on body image by examining international beauty standards and how striving to meet these ideals can contribute to self-harm and unhealthy lifestyle choices. The unit encourages students to develop a positive and realistic view of their own bodies, freeing themselves from societal and online pressures to look a certain way. It also explores the powerful influence of social media and other digital platforms on young people's self-perception and promotes strategies for building confidence, acceptance, and healthy self-esteem.
- **Year 10:** Our Year 10 students will be participating in a course on Relationships, designed to help them develop the knowledge and skills to make safe, respectful, and informed choices. The program

explores topics such as respect, healthy and unhealthy relationships, relationship violence and abuse, sexting, sextortion, and grooming. Students will also discuss love, sexual readiness, and the importance of abstinence as a positive choice. The aim is to equip students with the understanding and confidence to build safe relationships and to seek help or support when needed.

As always, please talk to your child about the topics we cover in the SET classroom. This can lead to some interesting dialogues where you can really engage and connect with your child, offering opportunities to discuss family values and extend their social, emotional learning into your home, creating open and honest dialogue.
